## December 2 - 6, 2009

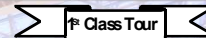

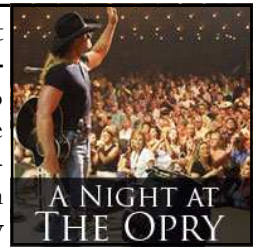

We will be stopping by the **Golden Pond Visitor Center/Planetarium** on the **"Land Between the Lakes"**. When the Cumberland and Tennessee Rivers were impounded to create Kentucky Lake and Lake Barkley, an inland peninsula was formed. In 1963, President John F. Kennedy designated the peninsula "Land Between The Lakes National Recreation Area" in an effort to demonstrate how an area with limited timber, agricultural and industrial resources could be converted into a recreation asset that would stimulate economic growth in the region. Today, LBL remains the country's only such demonstration site and is the cornerstone of the region's \$600 million tourism industry near Paducah, Kentucky. At the **National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows** in Belleville, Illinois savor a festive **holiday smorgasbord buffet**. Then, a fantasy of lights surround you at the nationally acclaimed **"Way of Lights"**, one and a half miles of light-trimmed trees and shrubs. Thousand of tiny white lights illuminate life-size statues and electro-art sculptures that depict scriptural scenes, reminding you of the true meaning of Christmas. We will overnight at Belleville, Illinois. (B, D)
