Day One - Travel Day

Start your journey as you make your way across Nebraska and Wyoming getting to know your travelmates with fun activities your tour director will have in store.

Day Two - Travel Day/Jackson, WY (B,D)
Traverse Wyoming today on your way to the gateway to Yellowstone National Park - Jackson, WY. Stop at the Abraham Lincoln Memorial Monument where a 48½-foot tall sculpture of Lincoln marks the highest point on the Transcontinental Route.

Day Three - Scenic Float Trip/Grand Teton National Park (DCB,L)

Get ready for a great day of sightseeing by starting off with a scenic float trip on the Snake River. Experienced guides will take you on a gentle cruise down the river with spectacular mountain scenery, beautiful fall foliage, and the opportunity to see native wildlife as they generally come down from the higher elevations to feed during the fall. Then, drive through the Grand Teton National Park where the Teton Range and Valley frame a majestic landscape of eight large lakes and glaciers, and extensive pine,



fir and spruce forests. Head back to Jackson for an evening at leisure. Your hotel is ideally located in the center of town so that you can enjoy all the fun that Jackson has to offer.

Day Four - All Day Sightseeing in Yellowstone (DCB,L)

Pick up a local, expert guide to take you on an extensive tour of Yellowstone National Park - one of our nation's national treasures for scenic beauty and wonder. Yellowstone National Park was the first national park established in 1872. The region took its name from the dramatic gold-hued cliffs lining the river basin. As you traverse through Yellowstone National Park, a "must" stop is at Old Faithful, Grant Village, and the Geyser Basins, along with the possibility of wildlife sightings from grizzly and black bear, elk, pronghorn antelope, moose and more. Your local guide will find a perfect spot along the way to stop for a picnic lunch to enjoy the beauty of the outdoors. It will be a grand day of touring our country's most famous national park.

Day Five - Buffalo Bill Center (DCB)

This morning, visit the Buffalo Bill Historical Center made up of five museums dedicated to the art, artifacts, crafts, culture, tradition and history of the American West. Later this afternoon, drive through the Big Horn

Mountains on your way to Gillette, WY, for your overnight.

**Day Six – Strip Mine Tour/Devils Tower/
Mt. Rushmore Evening Illumination
(DCB,D)**

This morning, find out how coal is mined when you tour an open-pit strip mine in Gillette. From your overlook, you'll see the process of strip mining, as well as how they load the coal cars that are so familiar on the Nebraska Plains landscape. Then, visit Devils Tower National Monument — a huge monolith resembling a colossal stone tree stump rising 867 ft. from its base. Native American legend has it that a giant grizzly bear tried to climb the stump creating the fluted columns with its claws. Then, proceed to Rapid City, SD, where you'll enjoy a final dinner with your travel mates before heading over to Mt. Rushmore for the very special evening illumination. See this very historical monument lit up at night, accompanied by our nation's National Anthem — the Star Spangled Banner. It's a patriotic tribute to our country and an experience you'll never forget!
